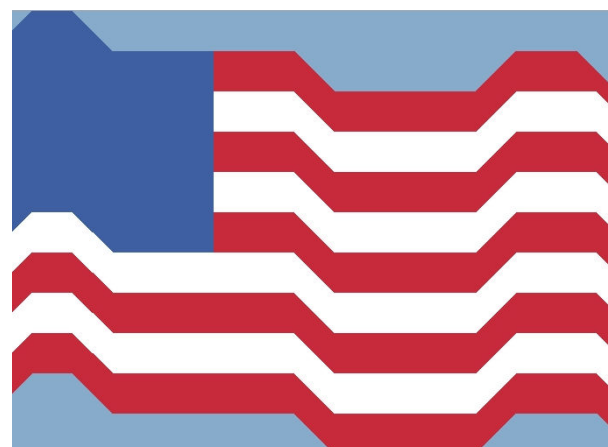


Flag Wall Hanging Picture 30"x22"



Step 1: Cut the fabric into the given number of 2 ½" and 1 ½" wide strips. The number of strips is calculated assuming 40" wide fabric. You do not always use a full strip.

Light Blue	1/4	2	
Dark Blue	1/4	2

Step 2: Use the charts below to cut the strips into the appropriately sized pieces. Keep the pieces sorted and labeled with their letter designators for easy assembly.

Take the 2 ½" strips for the yellow chart and 1 ½" strips for the pink chart and cut the pieces by letter, starting with the longest length. When applicable you can cut multiple colors at the same time. Label these pieces with the appropriate letter and set aside.

**Cut the single 1 ½ x 1 ½ Light Blue and Dark Blue squares from the wider strips.*

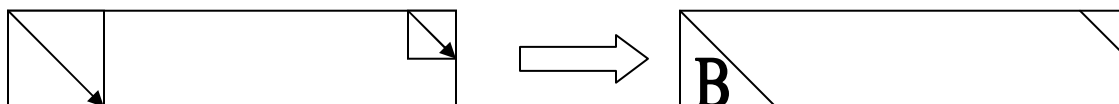
Triangles:

The **A**, and **B**, pieces are for making "quick corner" half square triangles.

The easiest way to get a good triangle is to use this overlapping method. For this method draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all A and B pieces. This will be your sew line.

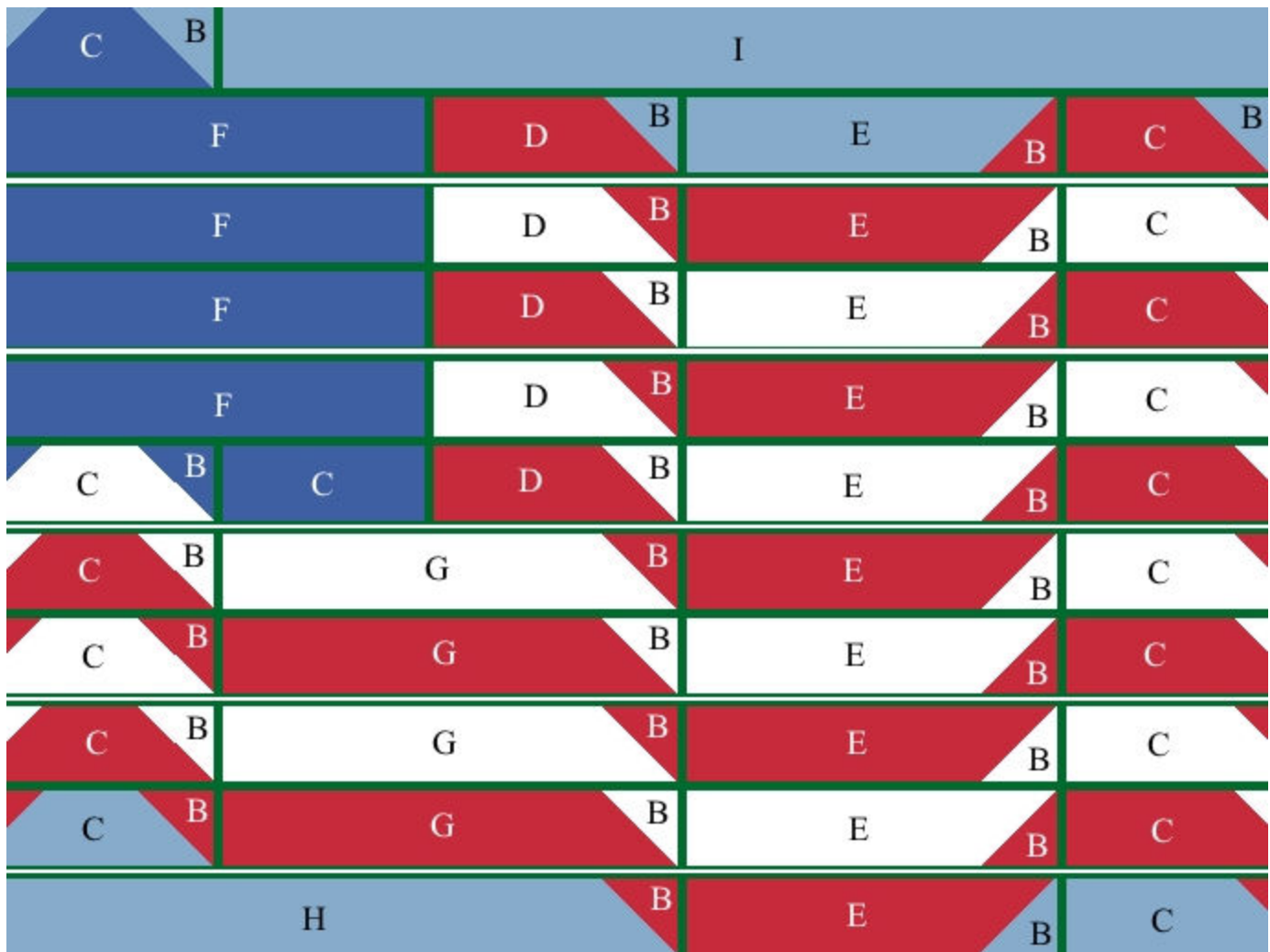
Then take the appropriate square and place it on a larger rectangle piece, or on another square of the same size, right sides together with the drawn line going the same way it does in the picture. Then sew on the diagonal line. Folding the cloth on the sew line with the point back toward the corner, if the edges of the triangle are even with edges of the rectangle then cut off extra fabric underneath a 1/4 inch from the seam. Press open and this creates the needed triangle.

***The "A" pieces are not labeled on the map to avoid crowding and confusion. All unlabeled triangles should be sewn using the above stated method.**



Step 3: Use your labeled pieces and the picture map to sew the entire quilt top using 1/4 inch seams. We recommend that you press the seams open for a better overall appearance.

***Make sure you have a true 1/4 inch seam or the pieces will not line up.**



***The "A" pieces are not labeled on the map to avoid crowding and confusion.**
